

Deepening and widening co-production for better outcomes in health and social care

Follow-up Workshops

“Co-production recognises that people have ‘assets’ such as knowledge, skills, characteristics, experience, friends, family, colleagues, and communities. These assets can be brought to bear to support their health and well-being,” Derek Feeley, Chief Executive, NHS Scotland, and Rory Mair, Chief Executive, COSLA.

To support partnerships in taking co-production forward, JIT in association with Governance International, have held several regional training events on how to transform public services through co-production.

The demand for follow-up workshops means a set of training days in September are available to provide organisations with strategies and tools for mainstreaming co-production.

At these events, participants will focus in depth on:

- **involving the right people** inside and outside your organisation who can help to make the co-production strategy a success,
- **marketing** it by developing effective incentives to bring wider stakeholders on board and
- **growing** the co-production strategy within and beyond your organisation.

Organisations registering for the workshop will be asked before the workshop to reflect on how their co-production initiatives and experiences to date (positive or negative) might fit within the workshop format and are invited to prepare short presentations which will be discussed in small group sessions throughout the day.

These events are open to all partnership agencies but are specifically targeted at statutory NHS agencies and local authorities, as organisations particularly likely to benefit from rolling out co-production.
