Support From the Start: East Lothian Council, Mid & East Lothian CHP

Overview: This study visit will explore one approach to the co-production of early years supports and services for parents and children as developed by East Lothian services, communities and parents. Participants will receive an overview presentation, take part in a 'speed dating' session with some Support from the Start Champions, visit some of the initiatives supported by the model and get involved in a panel discussion with SFTS strategic leads and workers about the co-productive approach.

Participants will be shown one of the clinic facilities along with FEET 1st staff and volunteers, receive a short presentation, along with a Q&A with the team and volunteers.
